Course Overview

In this course we will be examining strategies for impacting our culture for the Kingdom of God. We will explore the role of the Church and the people of God within society and discern our calling in how to affect those around us for the Kingdom. We invite you to consider the view that Christians are exiles and aliens in this world and part of the Kingdom of God. This calls us to untangle ourselves from the systems of this world and live in a way that is set apart. The Gospel of Jesus and His Kingdom is the only power that will transform people. Legislating morality and ethics will not change hearts. We are called to radical allegiance to God's Kingdom alone in this view because it is impossible to convert a culture that has already converted you. We are called to serve one master and not get involved in civilian affairs.

We must examine our paradigm and worldview through a kingdom perspective in order to live as Salt and Light in Babylon.

Precis (Book Report)

Jesus Untangled's message is that the Church has been caught up in American Christianity which

cannot divorce their nationalism and patriotism from their Christian religion. Giles shows in this book how

Jesus' message was to be counterculture in the midst of empire and not to take over the empire through

attaining political power and influence in the major centers of culture. We are called to seek first God's

kingdom.

The Problem: How Nationalism Hinders the Gospel

Paul tells Timothy as a soldier of the Lord that he was not to get entangled in civilian affairs but be

focused on the Kingdom (2 Tim 2:4). The church has gotten tangled up in the affairs of America and this is

hurting the Gospel that Jesus is king because we are pledging our allegiance to a country and the ways of this

country over the ways of Jesus. Giles contends that we are to live here as exiles and aliens (Heb 11:13-16) and

to occupy until Jesus comes back (Luke 19:13).

A Matter of Perspective

In the second chapter Giles explains the way he views scripture in a very Jesus centered way. He shows

how a flat Bible reading is not possible because of the revelation of Jesus. Too often people use Moses to

trump Jesus. He shows that Jesus is the Word of God (John 1) and we should filter all things thought Jesus. The

Old Testament should be filtered through the lens of Christ. He brings up that many things are biblical (slavery,

polygamy, war, etc.) but not all things are Christlike.

The Way We Were: The Church Before Entanglement

Historically the Church has viewed the state as an adversary, yet a necessary evil. In this chapter Keith

Giles goes through the first 300 years of the church following the destruction of the temple with many quotes

from early Christian writer (Early Church Fathers) and shows how they refused to participate in government

and the army (war). He also demonstrates how the early church refused to baptize those who served in



government or the army without them renouncing their position within the government because the early church knew that one could not be part of two kingdoms.

How We became Confused About Who We Really Are

During the first 300 years of the church, Christ followers gave up their lives for Jesus under great persecution. When Constantine came into power, he had a vision of a cross in the sky and heard it said that "you will conquer in this sign". He essentially made the Roman world Christian by making Christianity the national religion. Yet Constantine didn't get baptized until he was on his death bed, nearly twenty years later, knowing that one couldn't be emperor and a Christian. This edict brought a sense of safety and power resulting from the merging of the church and state and began to corrupt the church through hierarchy (Catholic church) and the striving for political influence.

The Weakness of Politics as an Agent of Change

Giles shows in this chapter how the political process can truthfully bring very little change, yet to American Christians separating faith and politics is absurd. Giles looks at quotes from many modern Christian leaders and their view that we need to be in positions of power to influence and "turn America back to God" and what this requires Is political power. Franklin Graham suggests that if a Christian occupied the highest offices in the land and culture that our nation would be turned back to a "Christian Nation". But this is not true. Laws never changed anyone's heart and the Bible shows this with the Torah. An example is the abolishment of slavery still hasn't solved the problem and racism, and sex trafficking, a form of slavery is still a major issue in America. These are heart issues and not something we can legislate. The job of the Church is to work with the Spirit on changing hearts and not think that power over the political process will be the answer.

The Supremacy of Christ and the Gospel

The Church's quest for power and influence runs against the message of Jesus. We are shown in scripture that Jesus became a servant even unto his death and we are called to pick up our cross and do the



same, living a life as he lived. This is an upside-down way of thinking and living. It is power under and not over living, which flies in the face of gaining political power for "the kingdom". The gospel calls us to abandon the weapons of this world (war, power, and greed) and follow the way of Christ; the way of peace. The way of allegiance to King Jesus.

The Conspiracy of Entanglement

In this chapter Giles looks at how the Church has been entangled in the conservative republican party since Reagan. Over the last 40 years the party has been playing the Church by dangling the carrot of overturning Roe vs. Wade but even with a majority of conservative appointed judges in the last 49/50 years no action has been made. Giles lists many other issues such as business and shows how the American Church as been coopted into this conspiracy by thinking change will come through power. Joining the Democratic party is also not the answer, re-focusing our eyes on Jesus and placing our faith in him and his plan to change heart is.

How the American Empire Works

Empires exploit the poor in their own country and other (third world) countries. Giles shows how this has been done in the history of America and how America has become a superpower through loaning weaker countries money and then assuming power through capital. These business ventures do not benefit the poor but make the rich wealthier. Giles asks us to consider if we stopped exploiting these countries and thus, they would not have to immigrate to America, in other words what if we blessed them instead of exploiting them.

Why Your Vote Doesn't Count

The author shows in this chapter how the opinions and preferences of voters actually don't count due to lobbying. In America is it legal to buy political influence. Lobbyists even write the bills for our congressmen and congresswomen. The only way out of this is to make corruption illegal and if Christians participate in



government, even they often become part of this. Greed motivates our political system. Your vote will not bring change when those who you vote in are being influenced by the system of greed.

The Power of Fear

When people are afraid, they are easy to manipulate. Our political system is built on fear and we are taught to be pitted against others out of fear, but Jesus calls us not to be afraid and this is not a spirit from Him. These fears come in the form of tribalism and national identity. We are told who our tribe is based on the way we vote or believe and anything that might take that away from us drives us to be unloving and abandon the way of Jesus.

Our National Identity Crisis

Other than just Constantine's influence on Church and state the Reformers have a lot to do with the way that Christians view themselves in regard to nationalism. The Reformers saw themselves as both Nationalist and Christians and used their power to murder the Anabaptists who saw the way of Jesus as wholly other than the affairs of the state. And through this way of thinking they believed they were taking their countries "back for God". This way of thinking still plagues the Church today and many Christians are ok with violent tactics and tribalism to bring this about. These are things foreign to the way of Jesus. Christianity and nationalism cannot be mixed.

One Holy Nation

America is not the kingdom of God. We cannot expect America to become the kingdom of God by having the top influential positions in government. In Revelation it shows us that there is only one kingdom and all the other nations, not just the "bad" ones, will be replaced by God's kingdom. This will not happen by Christians taking over their governments. The one holy nation of the Kingdom of God doesn't happen when nations become a little more Christian or adopt moral laws.



Tribalism and Violence

Until we abandon our tribalism, we will never truly understand what it means to live in Jesus' kingdom. Jesus gave a parable of the good Samaritan which spoke of everyone as our neighbor. The Samaritans were hated by the Jews for their nationality, practices, and theology. Jesus is calling us to love our neighbor and we cannot do this when we think in an us vs. them paradigm. Christ is not divided, and tribalism is one step away from violence. American politics create this kind of worldview where republicans hate democrats a vice-versa. As a Christian we cannot bear these labels because our identity is with Jesus who is love incarnate.

America: An Un-Christian Empire

When we look at the founding of America, we will see much ungodly behavior that is filtered through a worldview of violence and power. We often hear that America is a Christian nation that was founded on principle of the Bible but when we look closer is this true? Giles shows how much of the America we experience today was built on slavery and genocide. If our founders were truly Christlike would there have been a slaughter of natives and the enslavement for the sake of the expansion of colonies and the economy? Christians set people free and do not murder and exploit. When we look at this through the lens of the gospels can we say that God help build America, when he says, "whatever you did to the least of these you did to me?"

Just War?

Most consider World War 2 to be a just war. Giles points out that American soldiers were surprised to find that the Germans were driving trucks manufactured and sold to them by Ford Motor Company. Their planes were also fueled with gas bought from American companies. Greed fueled WW2 and could have been ended before it started if these companies valued life more than money. Simply by avoiding the temptation of greed this war would have been avoided. Just war is an oxymoron. As Christians we are called to be



peacemakers, forgive, and pray for those who persecute us. Jesus equates love with obedience and when we love our enemies there is no excuse for believer to support war.

Living Untangled

The Gospel of Jesus is the most effective weapon against evil. If Christians believe that they won't give into fear. We are called to live as exiles and seek the good of our nation but not get involved in things that are not part of our marching orders for the kingdom, such as politics. The kingdoms of this world are fading away and when our king returns, he should find us already living in his kingdom and not participating in the kingdoms of this world.
